
NIBS UNDERGROUND BOOK TALK - JOHN TULLY ON THE SILVERTOWN STRIKE

Historian and novelist John Tully will give a talk about his book Silvertown. This tells the story of a very important strike in the history of the modern labor movement which has often been overshadowed by others of the period. Tully argues for the significance of the strike for both the labor and socialist movements. And, perhaps most importantly, Tully presents the Silvertown Strike as a source of inspiration for today's workers, in London and around the world, who continue to struggle for better workplaces and the vision of a "co-operative commonwealth."

John Tully currently lectures in Politics and History at Victoria University in Melbourne. He is the author of six published books a number of articles, book reviews and short stories. Tully is a socialist and was an active trade unionist during the many years he worked as a rigger in construction and heavy industry.
